Adobe® InDesign® is today's industry-standard desktop publishing (DTP) or page layout software. InDesign integrates seamlessly with the rest of the Adobe® software such as Photoshop®, Illustrator®, Acrobat®, and Dreamweaver®.

It offers extensive options to create richer and more dynamic documents.

Who should take Ardito's Adobe® InDesign® courses?
